Impact 25/26	
This year has been a particularly successful year for pupil's at Benyon primary school in sport. There was an increased number of sports offered during PE lessons and clubs, in part due to the funding of sport's equipment and increased hours of sports coaches and access to free after school clubs. Due to this allocation of funding, we excelled in a variety of different sports at county level. Teachers have been provided with coaching and support from our sport's coach to ensure that they are able to provide high-quality PE teaching. The leasing of the minibus has allowed a wider variety of children to represent the school in an increased number of competitions this year, with 23 different Thurrock School Partnership events entered. We also used the funding to create an inter-school Olympics within our trust, some of the successes this year were 3rd place on the medal table for Thurrock sports, (best ever standing)	

Just over 46% (206) of pupils represented the school during the year in an Inter sporting event and fully inclusive for both genders.
